
Overview

This standard covers the competences you need to enable areas cleared of munitions or specified targets to be remediated in accordance with approved procedures and practices.

You will be required to demonstrate that you can contribute agree with relevant parties what action will be taken, contributing to the development of an appropriate remediation plan to the agreed standard within the limits of your capabilities in accordance with approved procedures and practices.

This activity is likely to be undertaken by someone whose work role involves Weapons, Ordnance, Munitions or Explosives work activities. This includes people working as munition clearance managers and supervisors.

- You must be able to:*
- P1 work safely at all times, complying with relevant health and safety, environmental and other regulations, legislation and guidelines
 - P2 establish objectively the limits of your responsibility
 - P3 establish objectively the effect of the operation on the environment
 - P4 provide information or advice that is:
 - realistic
 - practicable
 - objective
 - P5 agree with relevant parties what action will be taken
 - P6 contribute to the development of an appropriate remediation plan to the agreed standard within the limits of your capabilities
 - P7 implement your agreed actions and adapt to changing circumstances
 - P8 communicate in a way that the audience can readily understand
 - P9 maintain an ongoing and accurate record of actions taken
 - P10 liaise with relevant quality assurance personnel

- K1 the health, safety and environmental and other statutory legislation, regulations and safe working practices and procedures and their implications for your area of work
 - K2 the relevance of personal protective equipment (PPE)
 - K3 the actions to be taken in response to an unplanned event
 - K4 the effects of search or clearance operations
 - K5 your audiences and their likely communication needs
 - K6 operational requirements and organizational procedures
 - K7 the most appropriate method and standards of remediation for the area
 - K8 your responsibilities, capabilities, limitations and resources
 - K9 the relevant parties and their areas of interest
 - K10 the role of quality assurance personnel
