

Overview

This standard covers the competences you need to pack or re-pack explosive substances and/or articles in accordance with approved procedures and practices.

You will be required to demonstrate that you can confirm the identity and condition of the explosive substances and/or articles to be packed, and their packaging,

confirming that the work environment and conditions under which the packing is carried out meet regulatory requirements in accordance with approved procedures and practices.

This activity is likely to be undertaken by someone whose work role involves Weapons, Ordnance, Munitions or Explosives work activities. This includes people working as managers, supervisors and operators in any authorized area where explosives are physically handed over including supervisors and operators involved in munitions clearance and search activities.



Performance criteria

You must be able to:

P1 work safely at all times, complying with health and safety, environmental and other relevant regulations, legislation and guidelines

P2 confirm the identity and condition of the explosive substances and/or articles to be packed, and their packaging

P3 confirm that the work environment and conditions under which the packing is carried out meet regulatory requirements

P4 adhere to the packaging instructions

P5 report any problems beyond your level of authority to the appropriate person

P6 mark and label the explosive substances and/or articles clearly in accordance with instructions

You need to know and K1 the health, safety and environmental and other statutory legislation, regulations and safe working practices and procedures governing explosives and their implications for your area of work

K2 the relevance of personal protective equipment (PPE)

K3 the nature, characteristics, hazards and risks of the explosive substances and/or articles

K4 the actions to be taken in response to an unplanned event

K5 any specific requirements relevant to the task

K6 the classification of the explosive substances and/or articles

K7 the importance of marking and labelling requirements

K8 how packages should be put together to form a load

K9 the meaning and importance of a valid UN

K10 the procedures covering packaging and/or their components

K11 the availability of appropriate equipment/components

K12 the correct use of tools and equipment

K13 the importance of re-using packaging

K14 the importance of maintaining appropriate security standards

K15 reporting lines and procedures

K16 the limits of your personal authority
